Commentary

- Exceptionally strong growth in royalties, but mainly due to quarterly fluctuations.
- 10% increase in demand on the Cochrane Library
- Traffic to the cochrane.org website has increased 66% from Q1 2015
- Dramatic increase in non-English usage of cochrane.org (from 52% to 64% of total) year on year.
- 78% of new reviews have summary of findings tables in Q1 (70% in 2015)

Key Target Achievements in Q1

Overview

- The Quality Strategy has been published on the Community site.
- Project Transform team successful in securing an AUD 928,000 Partnership Project Grant (2016-2018) from the Australian National Health and Medical Research Council.
- Agreed and signed MoUs with four translation teams, four more are underway, to provide financial support for their translation and dissemination work.
- Work on the new Cochrane Library platform is progressing to plan with new technology partner, Semantico.


- Structure and Function paper approved at the MId-Year meeting leading to a period of implementation planning and consultation for Q2-Q3 2016.















Notes on the data

- 1. Access denied means a user tried to download a full text, but did not have a subscription to the Cochrane Library. Demand is the combination of successful full text downloads and attempted full text downloads (access denied).
- This is a measure of sessions of the cochrane.org website
- Reviews: 13% decrease; Updates: 8% decrease; protocols: 31% decrease.
- Budgeted income and expenditure is a quarter of the annual figures, so does not represent anticipated quarterly fluctuations in spend and income.
- Part of Target 15 around systems is on hold whilst we investigate whether it can be merged with the membership work, hence amber status. These data are based on all reviews and updates published in Q1 2016. We provide additional data
- around empty reviews as some authors choose not to produce SOF tables for such reviews.
