ITEMS FOR YOUR ACTION:

1) Final consultation on Cochrane governance reform: Deadline 23rd August 2016

During 2016, the Cochrane Steering Group has been developing a proposal for the transition to a new governance structure for Cochrane, including a transition from the Steering Group structure to a new Cochrane Governing Board.

All Cochrane Groups and individual contributors are invited to discuss and have input into the current proposal. Final decisions on how to proceed will be made at the Steering Group meeting and Annual General Meeting at the Cochrane Colloquium in Seoul in October 2016.

2) Consultation on the Structure & Function of Cochrane Centres: Invitation to provide feedback

Centres and Branches overwhelmingly endorsed the <u>Implementing Strategy to 2020: Centres, Branches & Networks Structure and Function Review</u> paper and recommendations. Twenty-seven Centres and Branches voted in the Doodle poll and all of them endorsed the paper. Formal implementation of the recommendations will now begin, and supporting documents are being developed and will be made available soon.

Four webinars were held in July and August setting out these changes and to consult with collaborators on new proposals developed by the Central Executive following decisions made by the Steering Group in April at the Mid-Year meetings in London. Feedback in the webinars was extremely positive on these initial proposals but comments, questions, suggestions and views on them would be warmly welcomed.
