The prizes and awards that are presented at the annual Colloquia will this year be awarded at the Global Evidence Summit in Cape Town, South Africa on 14 September.

7) A double Cochrane celebration in Croatia – Cochrane Croatia gets independent Centre status

A double celebration of Cochrane was organized this year in Croatia where, in addition to the annual <u>Croatian Cochrane Symposium</u>, a celebration of Cochrane Croatia's independent Centre status was held on 8 June to a large crowd of Cochrane supporters, including government officials, health professionals, and students. 9) Celebrating 20 years of Cochrane in Spain

This year is the 20th anniversary of the establishment of the first Cochrane Centre in Spain. It was founded in 1997 as the Spanish Cochrane Centre and was located at the Corporació Sanitària Parc Taulí in Sabadell. In 2000, the Centre was renamed the Iberoamerican Cochrane Centre (IbCC), and has continued its activity at its current headquarters in the Hospital de la Santa Creui Sant Pau in Barcelona. 10) Living Systematic Reviews are going live

Cochrane's <u>Project Transform</u> team, in partnership with the LSR Network, have been working away for some time on the methods, and production and publication processes needed for Cochrane to be able to pilot Living Systematic Reviews (LSRs). After successful meetings and events at the Cochrane Colloquium in Seoul, and a recent two-day workshop following the Canadian Cochrane Symposium, the pilots are very nearly 'go for launch'! 11) Former South African Minister of Finance will open the Global Evidence Summit

Trevor Manuel, who served in the South African government as Minister of Finance from 1996 to 2009, during the presidencies of Nelson Mandela, Thabo Mbeki, Kgalema Motlanthe, and subsequently as Minister in the Presidency under President Jacob Zuma, will be the first plenary speaker at the Global Evidence Summit.
