## **ITEMS FOR YOUR ACTION:**

## 1) Voting open for Cochrane Governing Board elections - closing date 25 January 2017

Voting is now open for the election of four new members of the Cochrane Governing Board as of 5 January 2017. You can view the names of the 11 candidates and read their candidate statements on the <u>main elections page</u>.

All candidates for election are competing in a single field, and will be voted on by the entire Cochrane membership. There are no separate categories of internal Board members, or representation of specific constituencies. Eligible voters (see our <u>Board Policy and Electoral Procedure</u>) can now access <u>the voting form</u>.

To access the voting form, you will need to use your Cochrane (or Archie) login. If you are an eligible voter but do not have a Cochrane login, when asked to enter your details, click the link, and follow the instructions to create a new account. Use the name and email address usually used in your communications with Cochrane to ensure your access is granted. # 2) Elections to the Cochrane Council for geographic-oriented Groups – Centres and Associate Centres to vote by 20 January 2017

The new <u>Cochrane Council</u> was established in November 2016 at the recommendation of the Governing Board, following a review in which directly elected group representatives on the Board were replaced with representatives elected by the full Cochrane membership. The intention of establishing the Council is to ensure that Cochrane Groups retain an effective voice in Cochrane's leadership and strategic decision-making.

The Centre Directors' Executive was given the mandate to recommend two members from its membership or the wider geographic-oriented Group community. It asked the Centre & Associate Directors to decide on membership eligibility for these positions at the CD's board meeting in Seoul, in October 2016, and the following was agreed:

- Of the two positions available, both will be held by: a Director, Co-Director or Deputy Director of a Centre or an Associate Centre. Directors from Affiliates; and other staff members of Centres, Associates, and/or Affiliates, are not eligible.
- The Council representatives will automatically become members of the Centre Directors' Executive.

Voting on candidates standing to fill the positions will be by Centre and Associate Centre;
Affiliates are not eligible to vote. Each Centre and Associate Centre will get one vote for
each position available. The candidate(s) with the most votes will be elected. (In the event of
a tie, the Centre Directors' Executive will take the final decision.)

The term of membership will be two years. Members may be re-appointed using the process above, but may not serve longer than six years in total.

For this first election, the Centre and Associate Centre Directors have been contacted separately by email inviting them to stand for the positions available. Announcement of the candidates and voting by Centre and Associate will take place 16 January-20 January 2017, with results announced the following week.

It is expected that Directors of Centres and Associates will vote on behalf of their Group. They are therefore strongly encouraged to consult and discuss with their staff and Affiliate members about the candidates for whom they should vote.

## 3) Global Evidence Summit 2017: Call for abstracts open – deadline 1 March 2017

Opportunities to present special sessions, workshops, oral presentations, and poster abstracts is open as of 5 January 2017. This is your chance to be part of the Global Evidence Summit (GES) and we look forward to receiving abstracts around the theme: *Using evidence, Improving lives*. The GES replaces the normal Cochrane Colloquium this year.

- Mid-Year Meeting: Tuesday 4 April Wednesday 5 April
- Board (CSG) meeting: Wednesday 5 April Friday 7 April
