1. Strategic Session in Lisbon – Invitation for Governance Meeting participants to attend - 13:30- 17:00 GMT, Wednesday 21 March

At its meeting in Cape Town, in September 2017, the Governing Board approved the Cochrane Review Group (CRG) <u>Transformation Programme Implementation Plan</u>. This plan sets out the changes we will be making to ensure Cochrane addresses the challenges it faces in relation to the production of a comprehensive collection of timely, high-quality Cochrane Reviews, relevant to our stakeholders.

Within the first three months of 2018, we have seen the formation of our eight thematic <u>CRG Networks</u>, which will comprehensively cover all healthcare topics. The new CRG Networks provide an opportunity to optimize resources, support and leadership.

During the Strategic Session we welcome the wider Cochrane community to come together and discuss key objectives for CRG Networks in 2018, focusing on priority-setting; improving consistency in review quality; innovations; and support and mentoring for authors, CRGs, and Networks. The session will be an opportunity to influence the decisions and direction taken for the Networks in 2018.

Following the Governance Meetings, there will be a series of CRG Network webinars with an invitation to the wider community to ensure that all Cochrane's contributors are aware of the plans for 2018.

8. Closure of the US Cochrane Center

The <u>US Cochrane Center</u>, based at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, has closed. Director Professor Kay Dickersin, and Associate Directors Tianjing Li and Roberta Scherer have stepped down from their positions, but will continue to work with Cochrane in other capacities. Governing Board Co-Chairs Martin Burton and Cindy Farquhar thanked them for their commitment to Cochrane's work over many years.

We plan to establish a new US Network and will issue an invitation soon for expressions of interest from institutions and organizations in the United States to join the Network and host a new Cochrane US Center, which will manage the Network including the two existing US Associate Centers: Cochrane US West, which opened in 2015 based at the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) in Portland, Oregon; and <u>Cochrane Caribbean</u>, launched in June 2013 at the University of the West Indies in Jamaica. 10. Cochrane at the World Health Assembly 2018

The <u>World Health Assembly</u> (WHA) is the decision-making body of the <u>World Health</u> <u>Organization</u> (WHO). The main functions of the WHA are to determine the policies of the Organization, appoint the Director-General, supervise financial policies, and review and approve the proposed programme budget.
