

# 1 Introduction

Cochrane Review Networks have been formed to help overcome the challenges that Cochrane faces in review production, thereby ensuring high quality reviews that are produced through timely editorial publication processes and guided by a prioritisation of topics of interest to stakeholders. This strategic plan outlines planned activities of the Cochrane Acute and Emergency Care Network to support the work of Cochrane Review Groups that produce reviews related to acute care (characterized by sharpness or severity, sudden onset, and short course) and emergent care (arising unexpectedly, calling for prompt action) and prevention of the need of such care. These activities are planned for the period of two years covering September 2018 through August 2020.

#### 1.1 Background on Cochrane Acute and Emergency Care Network

The Acute and Emergency Care Network consists of five Cochrane Review Groups:

Group	Scope
Acute Respiratory Infections	Diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of acute respiratory infections.
Anaesthesia	Diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of medical conditions related to anaesthesia and perioperative medicine.
Bone, Joint and Muscle	Diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of fractures, dislocations, and soft
Trauma	tissue injuries of the appendicular skeleton and associated soft tissues.
Emergency and Critical Care	Diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of medical conditions (including non-trauma resuscitation) managed in the prehospital, emergency department, and intensive care unit.
Injuries	Diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of traumatic injury, including the resuscitation of seriously injured and burned patients.

The Network will work closely with two Cochrane Fields that are aligned with the scope of the Network: the First Aid Field (to be established) and the Pre-hospital and Emergency Care Field. The Network will also develop relationships with other Cochrane Fields such as Global Ageing and Child Health.

#### 1.2 Network leadership and support

The Acute and Emergency Care Network is led by a Senior Editor, Michael Brown at Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. In his role as Senior Editor, Michael will take primary responsibility in relation to strategic and operational activities to ensure the Objectives and Activities as outlined within this plan are addressed. He will serve as a member of the Editorial Board and contribute to developing the strategy and monitoring of the Cochrane Library. He will liaise between the Network and the Editor in Chief, the Cochrane Executive Team, and Centres in relation to training, technology, knowledge translation, and innovations in Cochrane reviews.

The Associate Editor, Liz Bickerdike, will serve in an operational role to support Review Groups as relates to the Objectives and Activities as outlined within, such as identifying quality issues in reviews, providing

editorial support, identifying and supporting implementation of mechanisms to ensure high quality review standards and editorial processes, and fostering communication within Network and between the Network and other Cochrane groups, such as the Cochrane Executive Team.

Additional support for the production of priority reviews within the Network will be provided by The National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Network Support Fellow. Support might take a variety of forms, such as assisting with priority setting, training, or assistance with Fast Track Reviews.

#### 1.3 Governance and management

The Senior Editor is accountable to the Editor in Chief of the Cochrane Library, while the Associate Editor is accountable to the Senior Editor. Review Groups are accountable to the Editor in Chief via the Senior Editor. The Senior Editor, with the Editor in Chief, is responsible for ensuring that each Review Group has a five-year accreditation process and any accountabilities of Review Groups to funding agencies are met. Parent institutions of Network leadership personnel hold no governance position in relation to Network activity.

Each Cochrane Review Group in the network is guided by a Collaboration Agreement that defines the responsibilities of Cochrane and the Cochrane Review Group and its Co-ordinating Editor(s). The Co-ordinating Editor is responsible for the management of the Review Group, and reports to the Editor in Chief via the Senior Editor of the network. By signing this Agreement, the Review Groups renew their membership with Cochrane as part of the Acute and Emergency Care Network.

# 2 Objectives and Workplan

#### 2.1 Preamble

Five main objectives have been identified to guide the work of the Acute and Emergency Care (AEC) Network in supporting the member Cochrane Review Groups:

- 1. Supporting review production and capacity
- 2. Evaluating Network scope and prioritisation of topics
- 3. Fostering collaboration within the Network and with the wider Cochrane community
- 4. Supporting knowledge translation to increase the impact of Cochrane reviews
- 5. Ensuring accountability and sustainability of the Network

Activities outlined below represent the key items that the AEC Network will focus on.

#### 2.1.1 Objective 1. Support Review Production and Capacity

The focus of this objective is to put processes and activities in place to ensure the development of high quality reviews in a timely manner, consistent and improved editorial processes, and to identify capacity-building needs and opportunities to accomplish those tasks.

Review Groups noted that tailored support for individual reviews early in the editorial process was helpful. We plan to explore sustainable approaches to develop this aspect, and to share experiences and expertise within the Network.

		iv. The Senior and Associate Editors, and Network Support Fellow will provide guidance and assistance for individual reviews as requested by Review Groups, for example:
		- Commenting on high priority, high impact, complex, or problematic reviews when requested by the Review Group
		- Consulting on individual editorial and methodological issues and concerns via email or teleconference

#### 2.1.2 Objective 2. Evaluate Network scope and prioritisation of topics

The focus of this objective is two-fold: (1) for Networks to evaluate scope, coverage, and potential gaps of the Network as a whole and (2) to specify what high priority questions/themes will be undertaken to produce reviews that cross-cut Review Groups (including Review Groups outside of Network) and are completed in a short time period, with support from the Fast-Track Service as needed and the effort of the Network Support Fellow.

All Review Groups have employed some form of prioritisation; we plan to share good practice and support Review Groups with formalising prioritisation plans where necessary, while developing the priority themes for the Network.

The focus of this objective is to implement regular communication with Review Groups to ensure group cohesion and to address, in a timely fashion, the needs and priorities of member Review Groups. Connection with the wider Cochrane community is also needed.
